Dear Senator Shelby:

Senator Mark Kirk (R-IL) has offered an amendment to S 1867, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2012, to compel the President to sanction the Central Bank of Iran upon enactment. The amendment should be withdrawn or voted down.

- Sanctioning the central bank of a sovereign country is tantamount to declaring war on the entire economy of the country.
- In the case of Iran, a major oil exporter and chair of OPEC, the effect on world oil prices, and the U.S. economy, would be hard to overstate, as the Administration has publicly declared.
- Such a U.S. action would end the multilateral cooperation that the U.S. has achieved, regarding Iran's nuclear activities.
- Both the House and Senate are considering additional sanctions legislation under regular order a deliberative process that led to passage in 2010 of the Comprehensive Iran Sanctions Accountability and Divestment Act (CISADA) and an unprecedented multilateral strategy towards the Iran nuclear issue.
